PHE and Training Hub Updates

- Janice introduced the Foundation Public Health Services (FPHS) framework, which defines a minimum set of
 public health services that must be available in every municipality. She explained that the FPHS Shared Services
 Review is a structured data collection and planning process to document existing Massachusetts local public
 health resources and services. The review includes three tools: the Cost Tool, the Service Delivery Tool, and the
 ISD Tool (if applicable). Janice then walked through the Cost Tool and the Service Delivery Tool, explaining their
 structure and the data they collect.
- For training hub updates, Terry announced a training workshop on food inspection report writing, aiming for
 quarterly events. The workshop will offer a mix of topics, with content drawn from FDA and OLRH trainings. The
 goal is to have a group size of under 15 for more interaction. The group suggested that the workshop should
 start with the intake of a complaint, not just the post-inspection report. Terry and Stephen provided updates on
 upcoming training courses for Tier 2. The group discussed prioritizing inspectors, especially new ones, for
 training over directors.

Epidemiology Updates

• Steven and Laura provided updates on three infectious disease situations: measles, avian influenza, and tuberculosis. The measles outbreak in Texas has grown to 58 confirmed cases, mostly among unvaccinated individuals, with 13 hospitalizations. Highly pathogenic avian influenza continues to spread, with 69 confirmed human cases and over 14,000 people being monitored after exposure. A tuberculosis outbreak in Kansas has

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- resulted in 67 confirmed cases and 2 deaths. Influenza rates are currently very high, with almost 10% of emergency room visits related to respiratory illnesses. There was also a recent clinical advisory regarding increased neurologic complications in pediatric influenza patients.
- Steven and Laura also provided updates on recent executive orders and policy changes affecting public health. They discussed the US withdrawal from the World Health Organization, a pause in federal funding for foreign assistance, and the retraction of numerous CDC datasets. There are also significant layoffs at federal health agencies, including the CDC, affecting disease modeling and tracking efforts.
